FRANZ JOSEPH HAYDN (1732-1809) - Haydn composed 104 symphonies and is called the father of the symphony form. He was born in Austria, close to the border of Hungary. 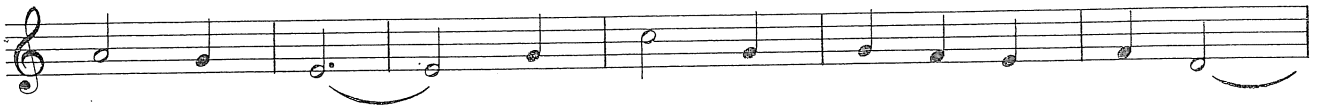

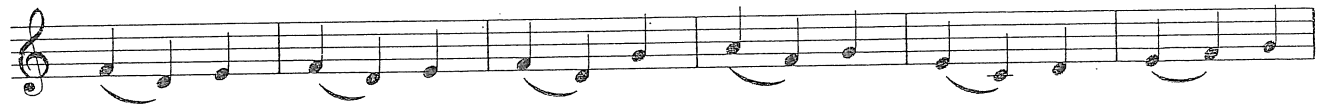
